Children from Saint Josephs School welcome the Easter Bunny to Galway

The Easter Bunny made an early visit to Galway to launch the Junior Chamber Galway Easter Egg Project. The project is organised annually by Junior Chamber Galway Members in association with Mars and Supermacs.

The project began with the hosting of a party for the children of St. Joseph's School, Newcastle. The party was held on the 2nd of April this year, with complimentary Easter Eggs for the children donated by Mars.

The second part of the project involves the collection of eggs after mass on Easter Sunday from those children who receive more than one egg and then distributing these eggs to less privileged children in the Galway area.

Junior Chamber Galway members will collect Easter Eggs in four churches on Easter Sunday, at the 10.00am Mass Barna, at the 11.00am Mass Claregalway, at the 12.00pm special childrens Easter Mass Knocknacarra and at the 12.30pm Mass in the Holy Family Church Mervue.

The Easter Bunny will also be present after each of the Masses to help collect and deliver the eggs and to thank the children for their donation.

The theme of the project is 'Sharing is Caring' and Junior Chamber Galway ask parents not to feel pressurised into buying extra eggs for their collection, but to encourage their children to think about donating that extra egg to a less fortunate child

The Easter Egg project has gone from strength to strength over the years and the children of St Josephs School look forward to the party. The project could not be undertaken without the support of Mars Ireland and Supermacs, and most importantly all those generous children who give one of their Easter eggs on Easter Sunday.
